New Features

- **New SharePoint 2001 to SharePoint 2010 Migration Support**

DocAve Migrator 2.1 has been updated to support migrations from SharePoint Portal Server 2001 in to SharePoint 2010 or SharePoint Foundation 2010. For a full list of supported content and components that can be migrated in to SharePoint 2010 please see the DocAve Migrator v2.1 User Guide.

- **SharePoint 2001 to SharePoint 2007 Migration Enhancements**

As a response to customer requests, DocAve Migrator v2.1 also includes enhancements to migrations from SharePoint Portal Server 2001 to Microsoft Office SharePoint Server 2007 or Windows SharePoint Services 3.0. DocAve Migrator will now show the number of items which will be migrated when an administrator selects to back up their content before migrating, and now includes additional group controls to include all permissioned groups during a migration.

Bug Fixes

- **Advanced Configuration Restoration Issues resolved when Migrating from SharePoint 2001 to 2007**

Previously, creating a restoration plan in an environment where an Administrator had configured either to *Not Overwrite Existing Data* or had changed the *enablesecurityfirstinheritance* property to *true* in the *env.cfg* file would result in unexpected behaviors. These issues have been resolved in DocAve Migrator v2.1.

- **Unexpected behavior when migrating with *Versioning* enabled in the Migration Destination**

Administrators were previously unable to restore some content to a SharePoint 2007 environment when versioning was enabled in the target destination. This issue has been resolved and administrators may now utilize versioning for restoring content to versioned lists or libraries.

Known Issues

- **Migration of SharePoint groups with existing users in destination**

Please note that if a user has permissions in both the source SharePoint 2001 location and the target SharePoint 2007 or SharePoint 2010 environment or a source user is mapped to an already existing user in the destination environment, the user's permissions from the SharePoint 2001 environment will not be migrated over. This is to ensure that the destination permissions (which should be the most current assigned permissions) are not altered during a migration.

- **Unable to resume Administrator aborted Migration Jobs**

We are currently unable to successfully complete migrations in which the Administrator aborts and then resumes the job during the Backup process. If you must abort a migration during the backup phase of the job, please restart the migration, do not resume the current migration as not all data will be migrated.

- **Migration Jobs Occuring in different Time Zones**

Before beginning any migrations, please ensure that the time zone values in both the source and target Windows server are set to the same time zone. We have experienced unexpected behavior when migrating across different time zones, even if the UTC time zone is consistent in both environments.

- **Customized profiles resulting in failed Migrations**

If you utilize customized profiles on files, please ensure that only one customized profile is attached to each file before it is migrated. Also, please note that the Customized Profile Attribute can only be successfully migrated when not selecting to restore profiles as well. Migrator also may experience unexpected behavior when applying a new profile to SharePoint 2001 content with the field type list or multivalue list, as only the selected fields in these profiles will be able to be migrated.
